For those applying to a **Provincial Evaluator**: It is your responsibility to ensure that you have a Level III manual (either Fast Pitch or Slo-Pitch) & be fully versed in the 3 umpire system. It is the applicant's responsibility to know the three umpire system.

The deadline for branches to submit these completed forms and provide a copy of a most recent evaluation to the ASUA Umpire-In-Chief is December 31. Each applicant must submit their application to their local branch within the local branch's deadline. **APPLICANTS ARE NOT TO SUBMIT THE APPLICATION DIRECTLY TO THE ASUA UMPIRE-IN-CHIEF DIRECTLY.**

Eligibility:

1. To officiate in any Canadian Championship, an umpire must have been affiliated with Softball Canada for two (2) consecutive years prior to the current year and also in the year in which they are officiating a Canadian Championship . The deadline date for affiliations of umpires selected to Canadian Championship is July 1 of the current year. The Provincial/Territorial Umpire-In-Chief must ensure the eligibility of each umpire when they are recommended. A Canadian Championship Umpire Information Report shall be filled out and submitted to the National Director of Umpires for each umpire being nominated.
2. The National Director of Umpires will be empowered to deal with umpire eligibility and qualifications in regard to all Canadian Championships.
3. The National Director of Umpires shall have the right to refuse any umpire recommended by the Provincial/Territorial Umpire-In-Chief, regardless if the umpire meets all eligibility criteria.
4. For **Senior Men's, Senior Women's, and Junior Men's Fast Pitch** Canadian Championships, as well as **Senior Men's and Master Men's 35+ Slo-Pitch** Canadian Championships, consideration will be given only to those umpires that are **Level IV certified**.
5. For **all other** Canadian Championships, consideration will be given only to those umpires that are **Level III certified**. A **Level IV Theory Clinic** is required before application to a Canadian Championship.

6. According to the policies of Softball Canada, each Province/Territory is entitled to send one umpire to each Canadian Championship event every year.
7. Umpires working at a Canadian Championship must wear the uniform and follow established written guidelines as outlined by Softball Canada.
8. To officiate in any **Western Canadian Championship**, an umpire must have affiliated with Softball Canada for two (2) consecutive years prior to the current year and also in the year in which they are officiating a Western Canadian Championship. Consideration will be given only to those umpires that are **Level III certified**.
9. To officiate in any **Provincial Evaluator Championship**, an umpire must have affiliated with Softball Canada for two (2) consecutive years prior to the current year and also in the year in which they are officiating at a Provincial Championship. Consideration will be given only to those umpires that are **Level II certified**. The Provincial Evaluator Championships are **Bantam 'A' Girls FP, Open & Int 'B' & 'C' Men's FP, Co-Ed SP, Master Men's & Women's SP, and Senior Women's SP.**
